The award winning AT&T bridge cover was designed by Andrew Formichella. Working directly with the fabricator, Fabric Structures Inc., we streamlined the design and construction process, the constraints of the budget and schedule were eliminated.

The bridge cover was designed and produced within 6 weeks. Our detail techniques and cooperation with the fabricator brought it in exactly on time and budget.

The design was sensitive to the original AT&T structure, thus unifying the venue for designer Bruce Rodgers, Tribe Inc. The bridge ultimately became the focal point of the entire facility.
